

Reedy Services Set For Tuesday

Mr. Reedy died at 9.05 a.m. Saturday morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Alta Toppe, of Brownstown, following an illness of two weeks.

He was born on Jan. 3, 1872, near Freetown, the son of the late Isaac Newton and Margaret Mc-Kain Reedy.

Moving to Illinois as a young man, he was married ats Enfield, Ill., in 1899 to the late Stella Thomas, who preceded him in ceath in 1912. He returned to Brownstown, and in 1914 married the late Moss K lay camp of Brownstown who preceded him in ceath in 1952.

Mr. Reedy worked as a farmer in Jackson county until 1927, then operated a grocery in Brownstown until 1945, after which he returned to farming.

He was well known all through Jackson county and was considered, in the words of one triend, "a very fine old gentlemen whose help could always be relied upon in any effort aimed at uplifting the community."

Mr. Reedy is survived by three daughters; Mrs. Alta Toppe, Brownstown; Mrs. Alte Thompson, Cortland; Mrs. Helen Matlock, Brownstown; two sons, Lawrence Reddy, Brownstown; John Jacob Reedy, Bloomington, Ind.; by two sisters, Mrs. Bert Boling, Brownstown, Mrs. Henry Moritz, Seymour; by one Brother, Frank Reedy of East St. Louis III, and by 11 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
