Reich—Miss Carrie Reich, whose illness has been mentioned in these columns, passed away at her home in Brownstown Sunday afternoon, March 11, following a long illness, aged 42 years, 10 months and 25 days.

She was the daughter of George and Louise Reich and was born in Seymour April 16, 1880. She graduated from the Shields high school with the class of 1897. After her graduation she went to Louisville, where she was employed as a stenographer until 1915, when the family moved to Brownstown.

Miss Reich acted as secretary to the Jackson County Draft Board and rendered valuable and efficient service to that body during the world war. She was also bookkeeper at the Kieffer Paper Mill, but on account of poor health was forced to give up her position. She possessed a very sunny lovable disposition and was often referred to as a girl that always wore a smile. Since coming to Brownstown she had endeared herself to a large circle of friends and acquaintances by her winning ways. She was a devout member of the Presbyterian church.

She leaves to cherish her memory her mother, two sisters, Misses Amelia and Alma, both at home, and one brother, Charley Reich, of Louisville. Her father preceded her to the grave in 1920.

Funeral services were conducted at her late home Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. F. M. Moore, pastor of the Presbyterian church, officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
