C. T. Reinbold, 80, B'town, Dies At County Courthouse

Charles 'Carl' T. Reinbold, 80, a Brownstown justice of the peace for the past seven years and one of the town's most highly respected citizens, died suddenly Thursday noon while at the county courthouse. He was a former Brownstown town clerk and served three terms as Brownstown township trustee. He also assisted in assessing for the township for several years.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Saturday from the Winklepleck Funeral Home at Brownstown with the Rev. H. G. Ramsey, pastor of the Brownstown Methodist Church, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery at Brownstown.

Mr. Reinbold was born Nov. 18, 1877, in Brownstown township, the son of the late Phillip and Nancy M. Bland Reinbold. He was married Dec. 25, 1898, at Vallonia to the former Miss Grace Lois Vinson, who survives.

Active in many civic organizations, Mr. Reinbold had spent his entire life in Brownstown. Forty years of Mr. Reinbold's early life was spent in the grocery business. He began as a grocer at the age of 16, and later in life, he had owned and operated his own grocery store at Brownstown.

A town clerk at Brownstown for 26 years, Mr. Reinbold was also trustee of Brownstown township for 12 years. He was first elected as trustee for one term and later was elected for two terms in succession.

Mr. Reinbold was a 50-year member of the Brownstown Lodge No. 60, Knights of Pythias, and a member of the Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons, at Brownstown.

Well known and highly respected, Mr. Reinbold's sudden death saddened the hearts of the many people who knew him in Brownstown and throughout Jackson county.

Besides the widow, Mrs. Grace Lois Reinbold, 108 North Sycamore street, Brownstown, he is survived by a son, Thomas L. Reinbold, Brownstown; two grandsons, J. W. Reinbold and Charles Robert Reinbold, both of Louisville, and a sister, Mrs. Orpha Jones, of Indianapolis. Mr. Reinbold was an uncle of Clifford Reinbold of this city.
