REINBOLD—Philip Reinbold, whose death was briefly mentioned last week, was born at Nassau, Germany, August 18, 1843, and died at his home in Brownstown, February 21, 1906, aged 62 years, 6 months and 8 days. He came with his father's family to the United States, landing in Ohio in 1844, and from there came to Seymour in 1848, and soon after Mr. Reinbold located at Brownstown. He was united in marriage to Nancy M. Bland January 15, 1866, who survives him. To their union were born ten children, six of whom are still living, four sons and two daughters, viz: Will, Chas. Andrew, Lindsey, Miss Florence and Mrs. Orpha Hurst. Three half brothers, two sisters and his step-mother also survive him. His only brother preceded him to the grave about thirty years ago. He was a veteran of the Civil War having faithfully served his country three years in Company F., 65th Ind. Vols., and was an earnest member of the G. A. R. Post at this place. He was converted and connected himself with the United Brethren church when fourteen years of age and joined the Methodist church in 1877, of which he remained a faithful member until death. He was a highly respected citizen, of a quiet and pleasing disposition and had a host of friends. The funeral services were held at the M. E. church Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, under the auspices of Gordon Tanner Post, No. 159, Rev. T. W. Northcott officiating, after which the remains were laid to rest in Fairview cemetery.
