Death Summons Ray L. Reynolds

Ray L. Reynolds, age fifty, a native of Brownstown township, died at 8:15 o'clock Monday night at the Methodist Hospital, Indianapolis. Death followed an illness of four weeks with pneumonia.

In November, Mr. Reynolds had made a trip to California in an effort to regain his health but his condition became worse and he returned to his home in Indianapolis.

Mr. Reynolds, who was well known throughout the county, had lived in Indianapolis during the greater part of his life and had been in the life insurance business there for the past twenty-five years. He was born on February 17, 1887, in Brownstown township, the son of the Rev. and Mrs. F. H. Reynolds, both deceased. He was the sixth child in a family of eight children. He was married in Indianapolis in 1917 to Miss Nettie Coppin, who survives.

Mr. Reynolds was a member of the Old Findley Chapel M. E. Church at Honeytown and gave his life to God later in a service conducted by his brother, the Rev. M. H. Reynolds. He was a member of Washington Lodge No. 13, F. & A. M., of Brownstown, and of the Scottish Rite and Shrine bodies at Indianapolis.

Besides the widow, he is survived by two brothers, the Rev. M. H. Reynolds, pastor of the Woodside Methodist Church at Indianapolis, and J. C. Reynolds, also of Indianapolis; three sisters, Mrs. J. W. Gollmier, of Indianapolis; Mrs. Clarence Gossman and Mrs. William Schwein, both of Brownstown, and a cousin, Mrs. Janet Peters, of Valonia, who was reared in the same family and is like a sister to the others.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon from the Brownstown M. E. Church with Dr. Joseph D. Moore, superintendent of the Rushville district of Methodist Churches, in charge, assisted by the Rev. E. A. Dawson, pastor of the Brownstown Methodist Church. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown. Masonic rites will be conducted.
