Well Known Christian Minister Dies In Brownstown---Other Deaths Past Week.

The Rev. J. C. Reynolds, age 56, a well-known minister in Jackson and Bartholomew counties, died at his home in Brownstown Thursday morning, July 7, 1938, at 3:30 o'clock following an illness of a little more than a week.

The Rev. Reynolds was September 3, 1883, at Jeffersonville, Indiana, the son of Alfred and Tabitha Hartley Reynolds, both deceased. He was pastor of the Christian churches at Ratcliff Grove and Tampico, Jackson county, and Ogilville and Garden City, Bartholomew county, when he became ill.

He moved to Brownstown eight years ago from Trafalgar, where he was pastor of a church. He also had charges at Flora, Frankton, Daleville and other cities in the northern part of the state and a charge at Evansville. He had been in the ministry for thirty years. He was a member of the Masonic lodge. He was wellliked by his many acquaintances and his death came as a shock to the entire community.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Lillian Reynolds; three sons, Wharton Reynolds, at home; Willard Reynolds, chief operator of the state police radio station at Seymour, and the Rev. Ferris Reynolds, of Man-He is also survived chester, Conn. by three brothers, Joseph and Chas Reynolds, both of Tampico; H. Reynolds of Seymour and two sisters, Mrs. H. H.
