

Reynolds Youth, **Unconscious For** Four Months, Dies

Ronald Reynolds, year-old Brownstown youth, died at 4:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon in the Methodist Hospital, India-napolis, where he had been in a coma since he was admitted on July 3 for treatment of injuries suffered in an automobile accident two days before.

The accident occurred on July 1 on U. S. Highway 31, two miles south of Edinburg when the automobile in which young Reynolds was riding, collided with the rear of a cement-mixer truck. Also injured were Paul Hurley, 21, of Seymour, who suffered a fractured leg, and Hurley, and Tommy Martin, of Brownstown, who was badly bruised. All three were admitted to Bartholomew County Hospital, Columbus, and young Reynolds was transferred from there to the Methodist Hospital.

He was completely paralysed and only once during the more than four-month period did h show any signs of recognizing his mother and other members of his family, some of whom remained at his bedside constantly

for weeks.

Young Reynolds was born in Medora on May 12, 1926, a son of Alga Mae Goodpasture Rey-nolds and the late Orville Rey-nolds. He attended Brownstown high school and was well known among young people in this community. Shortly before his ac-cident he had enlisted with the Indiana National Guards and received his discharge while at the hospital.

Surviving in addition to the mother are five brothers, Rich-ard Reynolds, of Seymour; Glenn Reynolds, who is serving the United States Army in Korea and who was given an emergen-cy furlough after his brother's accident; James Reynolds, also living in Seymour and twin brothers, Raymond and Day-mond, of Brownstown; and two sisters, Mrs. George Rochner and Mrs. Charles Jackson, both living in Brownstown.

Funeral rites were held at o'clock this afternoon from the Zabel Funeral Home here in charge of Gene Dulin, Browns-town Christian Church pastor. Interment was in Fairview Cemeterv.
