List Of Deaths Not Reported In The Items From Our Regular Correspondents.

ROBBINS—Mrs. Nannie Robbins, wife of Joseph Robbins, formerly of this place, died suddenly at her home in Seymour Monday morning, May 29, 1916, of heart trouble. Deceased had been in poor health for several months although when she retired Sunday night she seemed as well as usual. Her death was a severe shock to her relatives and friends at this place.

She was the daughter of Joseph and Rebecca England, deceased, and was born at Dudletown September 17, 1854, being 61 years, 8 months and 12 days old at the time of her death. When a child she moved with her parents to Brownstown where she resided until about three years ago when the family moved to Seymour. In early life she united with the Methodist church at this place and afterwards transferred her membership to the Methodist church at Seymour.

Short funeral services will be conducted at her late home in Seymour Thursday morning at 11:30 o'clock after which the funeral cortege will leave for Brownstown and are expected here about 2 o'clock. The remains will be taken direct to the Methodist church where funeral services will be conducted by Rev. Edw. Schneider, of Hope, assisted by Rev. J. H. Carnes, of Seymour, and Rev. A. F. Hogan, of this place, followed by burial in Fairview cemetery.

Besides her husband she leaves one daughter, Miss Gertrude, and three step-sons, Lorenzo and George Robbins, of Nort Dakota, and Doss Robbins of this place. She also leaves one own sister, Mrs. Jennie Green, of Kansas, four half-sisters, and one half-brother, Mrs. George Perry and Mrs. Lillie Nichols, of this place; Mrs. Walter Johnston and Mrs. Dave Kellar, of Seymour, and Henry England, of Illinois, and one step-sister, Mrs. Absolom Robbins, of this place.
