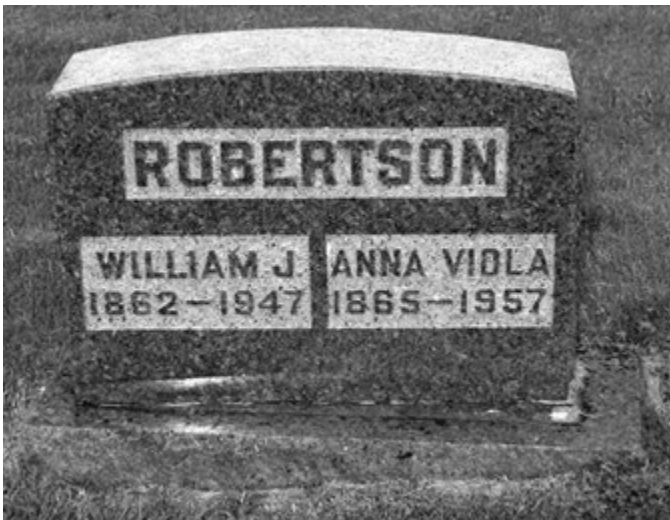

Viola Robertson Dies at Age 91

Mrs. Viola Robertson, of Brownstown, a resident of Jackson county for nearly a century, died early this morning at the age of 91 at the Phillips Nursing Home here.

Member of a pioneer Jackson county family, Mrs. Robertson was a life-long resident of this county and was an active participant in many community affairs until her health began to fail. She had been seriously ill for only about a month, however.

Born in Brownstown Aug. 30, 1865, Mrs. Robertson was the daughter of the late Andrew J. and Phoebe Vermilya Pfaffenberger. On March 22, 1885, she was married in Brownstown to William J. Robertson, who preceded her in death in April, 1947.

Although they had no children of their own, the Robertsons reared two children: Mrs. William Lynch, of Indianapolis, and the late Mrs. Ada Ellis Cooley.

Mrs. Robertson was an active member of the Brownstown Methodist Church, having affiliated with the church in childhood, and was a member of Brownstown Assembly No. 264, Order of the Eastern Star. She was also an honorary member of Fort Vallonia chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution. A conscientious worker in the organizations of which she was a member, Mrs. Robertson was widely known throughout the county and was held in high esteem by those who knew her. She maintained an active interest in current events until her final illness.

Survivors include one half-brother, John Allen, of Logansport; Mrs. Lynch; and a number of cousins, nephews and nieces in this area.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p.m. Thursday from the Brownstown Methodist Church, with the Rev. Wayland E. Siders, pastor, and the Rev. C. W. Taylor, of Indianapolis, former pastor, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.
