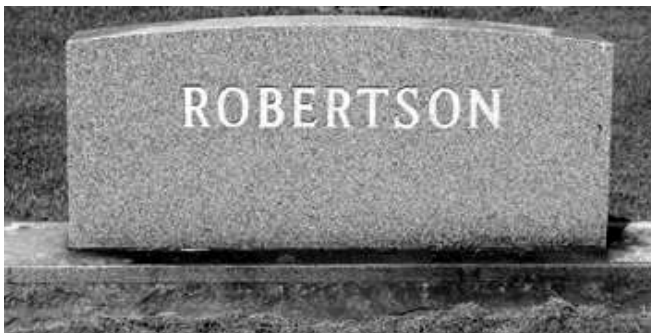

C. O. Robertson Buried Monday

C. O. Robertson, one of Brownstown's well known citizens, passed away at the Jackson county hospital in Seymour Friday night at 10:50 o'clock, following an illness of five days. *June 24*

Mr. Robertson was born August 11, 1874, to the late Charles A. and Isabelle Gosslee Robertson and spent his entire life in Brownstown. On November 14, 1897, he was married in Brownstown to Miss Matilda Wacker, who survives. *1949*

Mr. Robertson was a building contractor. He operated a planing mill at Ewing for a number of years and was well known throughout Jackson and Washington counties, retiring eight years ago. He was an active member of the Brownstown Presbyterian church and had been an elder of the church for a number of years. He was a director of the Brownstown First National Bank and leaves a host of friends to mourn his death.

Surviving besides the widow is one daughter, Mrs. Stanley Owen, of Brownstown. Also surviving are three brothers, Roscoe Robertson, of Brownstown; Dunham Robertson of Martinsville; Edmond Robertson, of West Palm Beach, Florida, and one sister, Mrs. Harry Shields, of Brownstown.

Funeral services were conducted at the Robertson home Monday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, with the Rev. Robert Crosby, pastor of the Winamac Presbyterian church, and the Rev. Hugh Simon, pastor of the Brownstown Presbyterian church, in charge. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
