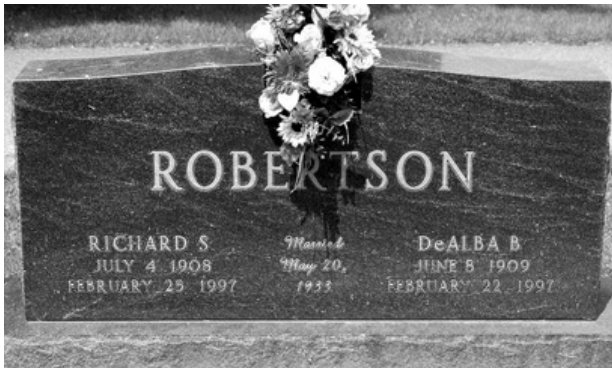

DeAlba B. Robertson, 87, Brownstown, died at 2:40 p.m. Saturday, Feb. 22, at Memorial Hospital, Seymour, following an illness of one week.

She was a homemaker and a lifelong resident of Jackson County. She was a member of the Brownstown Presbyterian Church, a past member of the American Red Cross, and a charter member of both Beta Mu Chapter, Psi Iota Xi and Memorial Hospital Guild. She graduated from Depauw University in 1931 and was affiliated with Alpha Omicron Pi at Depauw. She wrote the official song for Brownstown's sesquicentennial, "A Time to Remember."

She was born June 8, 1909 in Brownstown to the late A. J. and Cora Shepard Brodhecker. She married Richard S. Robertson on May 20, 1933 in Brownstown, and he survives.

Other survivors include one daughter, Mary Sue Spurgeon, Brownstown; two sons, R. R. "Phil" Robertson and John H. "Butch" Robertson, both of Brownstown; four grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by three brothers.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. today, Tuesday, Feb. 25, at the Brownstown Presbyterian Church with the Rev. E. Duane Aelick officiating. Burial will be in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.
