He was united in marriage to Miss Mary Stanley, of Campbellsburg, October 11, 1879. To their union were bornine children, of whom tight, Frank S. Lynn and Miss Edna, who live at home; Mrs. H. R. Cross and Wayne Robertson, of Winchester, Ind. Mrs. H. R. Noe, of Three Rivers, Mich.; Ray Robertson, of Lafayette and Roy Robertson, of South Bend, with their mother, survive him.
