ROBERTSON—Ferris Robertson, son of Edmond S. and Mary S. Robertson, who has been sick for some time, died Saturday, February 9, 1918. He was born at Ewing, Indiana, January 5, 1885, and at the time of his death was 33 years, 1 month and 4 days of age. The following obituary was read at the funeral services.

He received his education in the

Brownstown public schools, and from early childhood received his religious training in the Christian Sunday school of Brownstown. He was a faithful attendant of and an active worker in the Sunday school. The teaching he received in the Sunday school led him to make the confession of Christ as his saviour, and to become an active worker in the church. He was baptized into Christ April 6, 1902, by Rev. H. A. Wingard, then pastor of the Christian church.

He was married December 29, 1909, to Miss Carrie Jamerson, of Vallonia, Indiana. A happy, although brief, union was severed by the death of the wife May 15, 1912.

Much of his active life has been hindered by sickness and injuries. However, he overcame these obstacles and made himself valuable and useful both to his many friends. and to his Lord. For the past eighteen months illness has confined him to his bed, ministered unto by the loving hands of a devoted family. Throughout his sickness he displayed a patience and resignation that was typical of a truly genuine christian character. When the lingering illness had burned out the vitality of his body he quietly passed out into the undiscovered country, there to receive from his Lord the immortal, incorruptible body of the redeemed Besides his father and mother he leaves five brothers, Frank, Lynn, Roy, Ray and Wayne; and three sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Cross, Miss Allie and Miss Edna Robertson, together with a host of friends to mourn their loss.

The funeral services were conducted at the Christian church Monday morning, at 10 o'clock by Rev. Glenn Mills, pastor of the church, under the auspices of the I. O. O. F. and M. W. A lodges, of which he was a member, followed by interment in
