ROBERTSON—This entire community was greatly shocked Saturday morning when a message was received here by relatives announcing the death of Mrs. Ida Robertson, formerly of this place, which occurred at her home at Peebles, Ohio, Saturday morning, May 8, 1915, at eight o'clock.

The relatives here did not know of her sickness until Friday night when her sister, Miss Lena Boyatt, received a message stating that she was critically sick and asking her to come at once. Miss Lena left on the early train Saturday morning to be at her bedside but she passed away before she arrived there. She was only sick two days and the immediate cause of her death was peritonitis.

Mrs. Robertson was the second eldest daughter of William and Mary Boyatt, both deceased, and was born at Clear-spring, Indiana, September 29, 1879, and at the time of her death was 35 years, 7 months and 8 days of age. When six years of age her parents moved to Brownstown, where she spent most of her life. She united with the Methodist church at this place during childhood and remained a consistent member until death. The family moved to Peebles about three years ago and she and her husband transferred their membership to that place February 23, 1914.

Deceased was united in marriage to Edmond Robertson, of this place, May 6, 1896. To their union were born three children one of which died in infancy. The other two, Flavius and Lucile, together with their father are left to mourn the loss of a devoted wife and mother. She also leaves three sisters and two brothers, Mrs. Laurent Hamilton and Miss Lena Boyatt, of this place; Mrs. Daisy Shutts, of California, and Edwin and Everett Boyatt, of Marysville, Idaho.

The remains arrived here on train No. 1 Sunday morning and were taken to the home of her sister, Mrs. Laurent Hamilton, where funeral services were conducted Monday afternoon at two o'clock by Rev. C. N. Willson, pastor of the Methodist church, followed by interment in Fairview cemetery. The bereaved relatives have the sympathy of the entire community in their sorrow.
