Richard S. Robertson, 88, of Brownstown died at 7:13 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 25, 1997, at Memorial Hospital in Seymour after an illness of six weeks.

Mr. Robertson was chairman of the board of the Robertson Corp. and was a 1930 graduate of Wabash College, where he was affiliated with Phi Delta Theta Fraternity. He was a member and past trustee of Brownstown Presbyterian Church and was past secretary of the Indiana Flood Control Commission.

He was a county civil defense officer during World War II, served on the Jackson County Fair Board and was a member of Washington Lodge 13 of Free and Accepted Masons, Scottish Rite-Valley of Indianapolis, Seymour Elks Lodge 462, Harrison Lake County Club in Columbus, the Golf Club of Brown County, Indianapolis Athletic Club and the Columbia Club of Indianapolis. He was a past president of the Brownstown Lions Club and was a director of Muscatuck State Hospital, and was a past president of the

Millers' National Federation. Born July 4, 1908, in Brownstown, he was a son of Roscoe M. and Edith Shields Robertson. On May 20, 1933, in Brownstown, he married DeAlba Brodhecker, who died Feb. 22, 1997.

Survivors include two sons, R.R. "Phil" Robertson and John H. "Butch" Robertson, both of Brownstown; a daughter, Mrs. Larry R. (Mary Sue) Spurgeon, Brownstown; a brother, Joseph E. Robertson, Brownstown; four grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a brother, Charles "Buck" Robertson.

The Rev. E. Duane Aelick will conduct services at 7:30 p.m. Friday at Spurgeon Funeral Home in Brownstown. Private graveside rites will be conducted at Fairview Cemetery in Brownstown.
