

LOUIS J. ROCHNER, OF BROWNSTOWN IS DEAD

Funeral Services to be Conducted at Brownstown Sunday Afternoon.

Louis J. Rochner, age seventythree, a life-long resident of Brownstown, died at the home at 1 o'clock this morning. Death was due to a cerebral hemorrhage following a stroke suffered three days ago. Mr. Rochner had been in failing health for several years.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon from the Brownstown Christian Church with the Rev. William Richmond, pastor, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.
