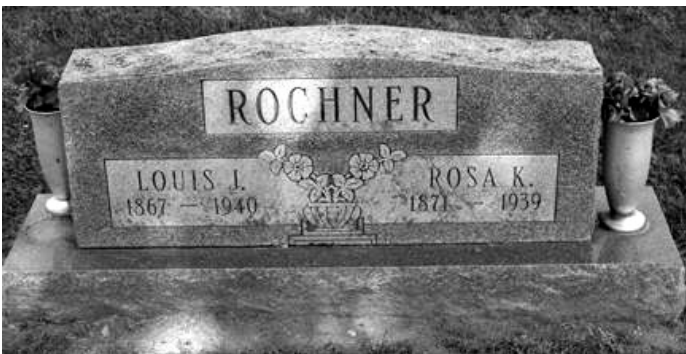

LOUIS J. ROCHNER, OF BROWNSTOWN IS DEAD

Funeral Services to be Conducted at Brownstown Sunday Afternoon.

Louis J. Rochner, age seventy-three, a life-long resident of Brownstown, died at the home at 1 o'clock this morning. Death was due to a cerebral hemorrhage following a stroke suffered three days ago. Mr. Rochner had been in failing health for several years.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon from the Brownstown Christian Church with the Rev. William Richmond, pastor, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Mr. Rochner was born on February 24, 1867, in Harrison county, but moved to Jackson county when a boy. He was married in 1890 at Brownstown to Rosa Krantz, who died on July 6, 1939.

Mr. Rochner was a well known carpenter and had been engaged in that occupation in Brownstown for approximately thirty-five years prior to retirement because of failing health about ten years ago. He was a member of the Brownstown Christian Church and made a host of friends throughout Brownstown and Jackson county who mourn his death. He was a member of the Modern Woodmen Lodge at Brownstown.

Surviving are two sons, Ralph Rochner and William Rochner, both of Brownstown; two daughters, Mrs. Anna Green, and Mrs. Clara Yeung, both of Brownstown and two brothers, August Rochner, of Corydon and George Rochner, of Palmyra.
