KNIFE VICTIM DIES FROM INJURIES

Jacob Rucker, Who Was Stabbed at
Crothersville Saturday Night,
Passes Away This Morning.

FUNERAL SUNDAY MORNING

**Special Grand Jury Will Likely be
Called to Investigate Affair Which
Resulted in Young Man's Death.**

Jacob Rucker, the young man who was stabbed at Crothersville last Saturday night when attacked by Curtis Johnson of Louisville, and Randolph Akres, of Jennings county, died at the Schneck Memorial hospital this morning at 7:30 after lingering for six days suffering from the wound in his stomach. Very little hope for his recovery was entertained by the attending physicians from the first owing to the seriousness of his injury. He gradually grew weaker day by day and the physicians gave out the information Thursday that the young man could not recover.

The young man is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Orlando Rucker, who reside one-half mile north of Tampico. His father preceded him to the grave about seven months ago, since which time he had been managing the farm for his mother. Five sisters, Mrs. Clark Robertson, Mrs. Ralph Johnson, Mrs. Ben Burcham, Mrs. Roy Beldon and Miss Anna Rucker, who resides at home, survive together with many relatives and a host of friends. The deceased was born and raised in Grassy Fork township and was twenty years old at death. The funeral services will be held from the Baptist church at Tampico Sunday morning. Burial will be in Riverview cemetery at Brownstown.
