RUST—Henry Rust, whose long illness has been mentioned in these columns from time to time, died at his home in Brownstown, Monday night, May 4, 1908, about 10 o'clock, of cancer of the spleen, aged 61 years, 9 months and 12 days.

Deceased was born in the countryside, near the town of Blasheim, Lebecka, Prussia, July 22, 1846. In September, 1856, at the age of ten, he sailed with his parents for America, arriving at New Orleans after somewhat tempestuous voyage of nine weeks and three days. From New Orleans they took a Mississippi river steamer for Louisville, where they visited a son for two weeks and then came to Seymour and settled in the Sauers neighborhood.

Henry Rust was married April 23, 1873, to Clara Robertsen. To this union were born seven children, three sons and four daughters: one daughter died in infancy. He is survived by his wife and six children, viz: J. W. Rust, of Honeytown; A. F. Rust, of Cortland; Mrs. Will McPherson, Mrs. C. E. Brown, Charley and Miss Grace Rust, of this place. He is also survived by one brother—Fredrick—and three sisters—Mrs. Louisa Weller, Mrs. Charlotte Korte, and Mrs. Fredricka Wacker.

Mr. Rust became a member of the Christian church at Honeytown under the ministry of Eld. G. M. Shutts. The funeral services will be conducted at the Christian church at this place Thursday morning at 10 o'clock, by Elders Wm. E. Payne and G. M. Shutts after which the remains will be laid to rest in Fairview Cemetery.

Mr. Rust retired from the farm and moved to Brownstown September 23, 1901, and was one of our most highly respected citizens. He was a member of the town council, and has taken considerable interest in the improvement of the town. He had a large circle of acquaintances and warm friends over the county, who extend their heartfelt sympathy to the bereaved family.
