James W. Rust, Native Of Shieldstown, Buried In Fairview Cemetery

Burial rites were held Tuesday afternoon in Fairview Cemetery here for James W. Rust, age 79, of Washington, Indiana, native of Shieldstown, who died at the family home in Washington last Saturday. Funeral services were held from the Gill Funeral Home in Washington Tuesday morning and the funeral party drove directly to the cemetery here.

Mr. Rust was a son of the late Henry and Clara Robertson Rust, prominent Jackson county family, and was born at Shieldstown on March 31, 1874. He was married to Eunice Rhoades, of near Seymour, who died several years ago. He had lived in Washington for a number of years and was widely known there.

Two sons, James Rust, of Washington, and John Rust, of Bicknell, and a daughter, Miss Mary Rust, also of Washington, survive.

Also surviving is a brother, Charles H. Rust, of Indianapolis, who is widely known in Brownstown where he lived for a number of years and where his wife, the former Miss Ida Lanham, taught in the Brownstown High School for several years; two sisters, Mrs. Grace Rust Frick, of Mount Dora, Florida, founder of the Russet Cafeteria chain, and Mrs. Lillie Brown, also of Mount Dora; a sister-in-law, Mrs. Andrew Rust, of Seymour.

A brother, Andrew Rust, of Seymour, and a sister, Mrs. McPhearson, whose son, Lowell McPhearson, is manager and co-owner of the Russet Cafeteria in Indianapolis, preceded him in death.
