Walter B. Sage Expires At 79 In Brownstown

Was Active In Town Affairs In
Past Years--Other Deaths
The Past Week.

Walter Benton Sage, one of Jackson county's highly esteemed and well-known business men, passed away at his home in Brownstown Monday evening, September 29, 1930, following a month's illness. Death was due to cerebral hemorrhage.

Mr. Sage was the last surviving member of ten children born to William and Emily Payne Sage. He was born in Washington county, Indiana, December 25, 1850, making his age at the time of his death 79 years, 9 months and 4 days. He has been a resident of Jackson county for 70 years. On December 22, 1880, he was married to Miss Katie Tappe. To their union were born two sons and two daughters, one daughter dying in infancy. Besides his widow he leaves one daughter, Mrs. Ethel Prewitt, of Brownstown; two sons, C. V. Sage, of Brownstown; Russell Sage, of Harlan, Ky., and four grandchildren.

For many years Mr. Sage has been engaged in the grocery business. He served on the Town Board for about ten years and was president of the Board when the Electric Light and Water Plant was built. He served on the Brownstown School Board for eight years and was postmaster at Ewing during the terms of Roosevelt and Taft. He was a member of the Methodist church and the Brownstown Masonic and Knights of Pythias lodges.

Mr. Sage was an honorable and upright man, and commanded the respect and esteem of a wide circle of friends and was greatly devoted to his home and family.

Funeral services under the auspices of F & A. M. Lodge, No. 113, were held at the Methodist church this afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. L. S. Lovell officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
