Mrs. Schwein, B'town, Dies— Rites Are Set

Mrs. Adda "Addie" Schwein, 82, 208 East Walnut street, Brownstown, died Saturday at 10:15 a. m. at Jackson County Schneck Memorial Hospital here.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10:30 a. m. Wednesday from the Brownstown Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Robert Reid, pastor, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Friends may call from 6 until 9 p. m. tonight and from 4 until 9 p. m. Tuesday at the Winklepleck-Weesner Funeral Home, Brownstown. Wednesday morning, the body will lie in state from 9:30 a. m. until the hour of the service at the Brownstown Presbyterian Church.

An Eastern Star service will be conducted at 7:30 p. m. tonight at the funeral home.

Mrs. Schwein was born Nov. 21, 1891, in Medora, the daughter of the late Walter and Jennie Parker Ganstine. She was a life-long resident of Jackson County and was married Dec. 24, 1912, in this county to Henry Schwein, who preceded her in death in 1962.

A member of the Brownstown Presbyterian Church, Mrs. Schwein many years ago taught school for five years at the old Durland School, no longer in existence. She also was a nurses' aide for several years at Jackson County Schneck Memorial Hospital. She was a member of the Brownstown Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, to which she had belonged for over 50 years.

Survivors include three sons: Charles Schwein, of Vallonia; Lloyd Schwein, of Jeffersonville, and John Schwein, of Indianapolis; one brother, Percy Ganstine, of Colorado Springs, Colo.; eight grandchildren, and five great grandchildren. One daughter, one sister and one brother preceded her in death.
