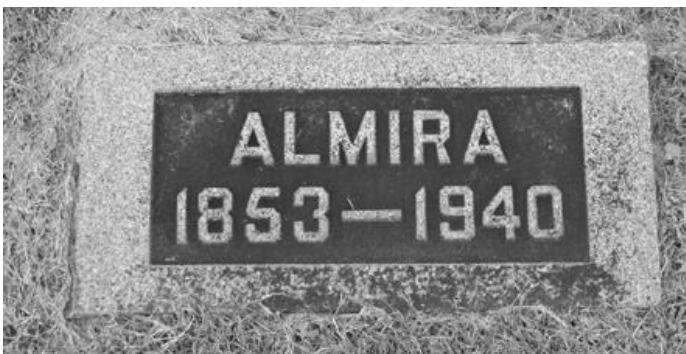

Former Resident Buried Here Sun.

Mrs. Almira Sewell, 86, Dies At Indianapolis Friday Following Long Illness.

Mrs. Almira Sewell, age 86, a former well known Brownstown resident, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Gladys Ross, at Indianapolis Friday morning at 8 o'clock. Death was due to a long illness of a complication of diseases.

The remains were moved to the home of her daughter, Mrs. Ethel Kattman, at Crothersville, where they laid in state until Sunday when they were brought to Brownstown and taken to the Methodist church, of which she was a member. Funeral services were conducted at 2 o'clock with the Rev. Clyde Black, pastor, in charge. Burial in Fairview cemetery.

Mrs. Sewell was the last surviving member of a family of ten children born to Henry and Zurelda Bultman. She was born at Pleasant Grove July 19, 1853, and spent her early life there. On October 29, 1871, she was married at Pleasant Grove to Elisha Sewell, who preceded her in death thirty years ago. For a number of years Mr. Sewell was engaged in the mercantile business in Swing. She continued to reside there for a number of years and later made her home with her children.

Mrs. Sewell was of a friendly, jovial disposition, was kind and obliging, and leaves many friends to mourn her death.

In addition to Mrs. Ross and Mrs. Kattman she is survived by four other children, Lonnie Sewell, of Brownstown; Sylvester Sewell, of Chicago; Mr. Edna Moore, of Atlanta, Georgia and Mrs. Minnie Fultz of Olympia, Wash.; fifteen grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.
