

Ed Shelton, 44, Night Watchman at Vallonia, Expires in Presence of Wife.

Edward Ellsworth Shelton, aged 44, bioward Elsworth Sheiton, aged 44, died suddenly Thursday morning about 7:30 o'clock at o his home about half way between Brownstown and Vallonia. He had been serving as night watchman for the merchants of Vallonia and returning home from his night duty had finished his breakfast. He was talking to his wife, when she noticed a peculiar look on his face and asked him if he was feeling bad to which he repiled yes and expired in a few moments. However, he had been in failing health for more than a year. Deceased was a son of Riley and Mary Shelton and was born in Brownstown April 25, 1885, and died Aug. 1, 1929, making his age at the time of his death, 44 years, 3 months and 7 days.
