

Mead Shelton, 51, Dies Suddenly

Heart Attack Of Vallonia Man Fatal As He Was Visiting Relatives In The Gossman School Neighborhood Sunday Afternoon — Other Deaths.

Mead Shelton, age 51, of Vallonia, died suddenly Sunday afternoon about 4 o'clock of a heart attack at the home of his brotherin-law, Earl England, in the Gossman school neighborhood.
