ALLEN A. SHEPARD DIES AT INDIANAPOLIS HOSPITAL

Widely Known Brownstown Business
Man—Funeral Will be Held
Monday.

Allen A. Shepard, aged 76 years, one of the most widely known and popular business men in Jackson county, died at 3 o'clock Saturday morning at the Long Hospital, at Indianapolis after undergoing an operation for cancer several days ago. Two years ago he suffered a stroke of paralysis after which he never fully regained his health and, as he was recovering satisfactorily from the effects of the operation, it is believed he suffered a second stroke which was the immediate cause of his death.

The deceased was born in Driftwood township, May 16, 1842, and had lived in Jackson township during the greater part of his life, residing in Cortland, Seymour and Brownstown, the latter being his home at the time of his death. Following his marriage in 1868 to Miss Fannie Holmes he spent two years in Kansas where he was engaged in business. During his residence in Cortland he was the owner of a general store and with his son, Elmer Shepard, was engaged in the same business at Brownstown.

During his residence in this city he affiliated with the First M. E. church, later transferring his membership to the Brownstown Methodist church, where he was an active member until the time of his death. He was conscientious both in the performance of his church duties and his business, and made lasting friendships wherever he was located. The deceased is survived by two daughters, Mrs. A. J. Brodhecker and Miss Caddie Shepard and one son, Elmer Shepard, all of whom reside at Brownstown.

The body was shipped here Saturday and was taken to Brownstown in the Hustedt ambulance. The funeral was held there Monday aft-
