**Dr. Harry Shields, 80,  
Oldest Dentist, Dies**

Dr. Harry Shields, 80, of Robertson in September, 1913. His Brownstown, oldest dentist in widow survives. Jackson County, died at 6 p. m. Friday in Methodist Hospital in Jackson County for more than 55 Indianapolis after a one-week illness. He had been in failing health for several years. He retired three years ago.

The father of Dr. Seth W. Shields, a prominent Seymour dentist, he was a native and life-long resident of Jackson County and son of a dentist. He was born May 28, 1881, to the late Dr. S. W. and Isabell Brown Shields.

His first wife, the former Ova Brown, preceded him in death and he married the former Mona

Dr. Shields was a dentist in Jackson County for more than 55 years and in 1942, he began practicing in the office of his son in Seymour. He retired three years ago.

He was a member of the Brownstown Christian Church; Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons; and Lodge No. 80, Knights of Pythias, in Brownstown. He was a member of the Masonic lodge 50 years.

Survivors besides his widow include one son, Dr. Shields, of Seymour; one daughter, Mrs. Jane Dillman, of Valonia; one brother, Lawrence Shields, of Brownstown; three sisters, Mrs. Roscoe Robertson, Mrs. Margaret Heller and Mrs. Lee Longacher, all of Brownstown; four grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

A brother, Dr. Scott Shields, and a sister, Mrs. Ethel Cummings, preceded him in death.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Sunday from the Winklepleck Funeral Home in Brownstown with the Rev. E. Lacy Satterfield, pastor of the Brownstown Christian Church, officiating. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.
