Dr. Tom Shields, Ex-B'town Man, Dies—Rites Set

Dr. Tom S. Shields, 59, of Richmond, formerly of Brownstown, died Tuesday in Reed Memorial Hospital, Richmond.

Born November 14, 1914, in Brownstown, the son of the late Dr. Scott W. Shields and Mrs. Shields, who survives in Brownstown, Dr. Shields was a graduate of Brownstown High School; of Indiana University, where he received a B.S. degree, and of the Indiana University School of Medicine, receiving his M.D. degree. He studied postgraduate medicine at the University of Pennsylvania and entered the United States Air Force in 1941, serving for two and one-half years in the European theatre as a flight surgeon with the 12th Air Force. After returning to the United States he was base surgeon at Peterson Field, Colorado Springs, Colo until his discharge as a lieutenant colonel in 1945.

Dr. Shields remained in the active reserves until he retired as a colonel in 1972.

Dr. Shields was engaged in ear, nose and throat practice in Richmond since November, 1947. He was a member of the American Medical Association, Indiana State Medical Association, Wayne-Union County Med-
