Death Comes Twice To Family In One Day

Death came twice Monday to the family of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Sinex, of Harrisburg, Pa., when the mother of Mr. Sinex, Mrs. Flora Sinex, 79, passed away in Brownstown that afternoon and an aunt, of Mrs. Sinex, Mrs. Neal Carr, died that evening at her home in Brazil, Indiana. Mrs. Edward Sinex had made her home since three years of age with her aunt following the death of her own mother.

Mrs. Flora Sinex had been ill about three months and arrangements were being made to take her by ambulance to the hospital when she passed away at 2:30 o'clock at the home of her cousin, Mrs. A. J. Brodhecker, with whom she made her home since 1940. Her death came as a shock to her relatives and friends.

Mrs. Sinex was born at Vandalia September 24, 1871, to the late George B. and Nancy A. Holmes Spurrier. She resided in Indianapolis a number of years and was employed as a proof reader in a printing office.

On May 9, 1905, she was married in Indianapolis to Frank B. Sinex, who was engaged in Y. M. C. A. work in various parts of the country. Following the death of Mr. Sinex in 1922 she and her son made their home in Brownstown, later moving to Jeffersonville and later to Indianapolis.

Surviving besides the son and Mrs. Brodhecker, are three other cousins, Elmer Shepard and Miss Caddie Shepard, of Brownstown, and Claude C. Spurrier, of Indianapolis.

Funeral services were conducted this afternoon at 2:00 o'clock from the Winklepleck funeral home in Brownstown in charge of the Rev. Russell Hall, pastor of the Methodist church of Brownstown, of which she was a member. Burial in Fairview cemetery.

Services for Mrs. Carr will be held at Brazil Thursday.
