He worked for the Corps of Engineers, building Wolf Creek Dam at Jamestown, Ky., in the 1950s. He retired from Morgan Packing Co.

The Rev. William C. Skaggs was pastor of Jamestown Pentecostal Church for 10 years and

also was a retired pastor of Glenlawn Pentecostal Church in Seymour.
