

George Snider Dies, Services Set Tuesday

George F. Snider, 96, North High street, Brownstown, died at 6:40 p. m. Saturday at Schneck Memorial Hospital after an illness of several years.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Tuesday from the Winklepleck-Weesner Funeral Home, Brownstown, with the Rev. Robert Riggs, pastor of the Brownstown United Methodist Church, officiating. Military graveside services will be conducted at Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

A native of Shelby County, Mr. Snider was born March 14. 1876. to the late Jacob and May Huffman Snider. On September 27, 1916, in Shelbyville, he married the former Maye Barkman, who survives.

Mr. Snider was a member of the Brownstown United Methodist Church. A disabled veteran, he began his Army career in 1894 with the Indian Campaign, followed by the Spanish-American War and World War I.

A lifetime member of the Brownstown American Legion, Mr. Snider was past ninth district commander of the American Legion, and past commander of Camp Jackson Post No. 112, American Legion. He served two years as Jackson County veterans officer and served on the Selective Service board for several years.

Survivors in addition to the widow include one daughter, Mrs. Forrest (Leona) Stewart, of Brownstown; two grandchildren and seven greatgrandchildren.

Two brothers, one daughter and one sister preceded Mr. Snider in death.
