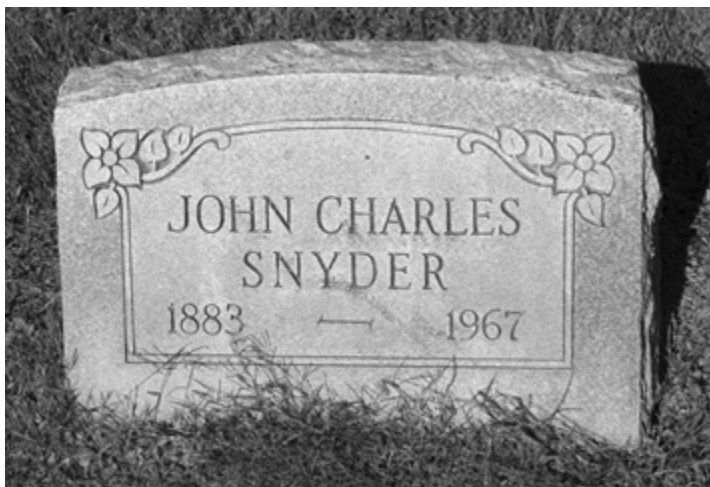

Rites Set For Jackson Native

John Charles Snyder, 83, of Jackson, Tenn., a native of Jackson County, died at 7 a. m. Sunday at his home there after an illness of two years.

Funeral services will be conducted at 10 a. m. Tuesday from the Griffin Funeral Home in Jackson. At 11 a. m. Wednesday graveside services will be conducted from Fairview Cemetery in Brownstown with the Rev. Robert Reid, pastor of the Brownstown Presbyterian Church, officiating.
