## Rites To Be Friday

Mrs. Essie Sommers died at 3:00 o'clock this morning in the Jackson County Hospital where she had been a patient several days, transferred there from the Jackson Park Convalescent Center, Seymour, after she suffered a second stroke. She had been ill two years.

Funeral rites will be held at 1:00 o'clock Friday afternoon from the Spurgeon Funeral Home, in charge of Evan Bolejack, pastor of the Brownstown Christian Church. Burial will be in Riverview Cemetery, north of Seymour.

A native and life-long resident of Brownstown, Mrs. Sommers was born on September 20, 1900, a daughter of the late George and Louise Emmert Hurley. On Christmas Day, 1922, she was married to George H. Sommers, who died in 1953.

Mrs. Sommers was a retired school teacher, was one of the most active members of Brownstown Christian Church, as long as her health permitted, was a member of Brownstown Chap-

ter, Order of Eastern Star and Lucullus Temple, Pythian Sisters, of Brownstown.

She taught school in Jackson, Jennings and Bartholomew Counties and in the Connersville city schools until her retirement in May of 1965.

Surviving are three sons, Claude Louis Sommers, a member of the Brownstown Central High School faculty, and David R. Sommers, of Brownstown, and Henry Sommers, of Crawfordsville; a daughter, Mrs. Marion (Catherine) Burleson, of Indianapolis; a brother, Claude Hurley, Brownstown rural route, and two sisters, Mrs. LaVesta McCrary, of Brownstown, and Mrs. Virgil (Bessie) Finchum, of Brownsville, Indiana.
