## Funeral Rites Held For Fletcher Stafford

Funeral services for Fletcher Stafford, 62, a life-long resident of Jackson county, were conducted this afternoon from the Rock of Light Church in Brownstown, with the Rev. Raymond Gaiter, pastor, in charge. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery.
