Riley Stevens Dies At Hospital—Rites Held This Afternoon

Riley Stevens, well-known Brownstown resident, died early Sunday morning at the Jackson county hospital, where he had been admitted for medical treatment on February 20. He had been in failing health for several years.

Funeral rites were held this afternoon from the Winklepleck Funeral Home, in charge of E. Lacy Satterfield, pastor of the Brownstown Christian Church. Interment was in Fairview cemetery here.

Born in northern Jackson county, January 7, 1884, Mr. Stevens, who had spent practically all of his life in Brownstown, was a son of the late David and Sarah Jane Marlett Stevens.

On December 24, 1916, he was married at Seymour, to Ethel Kennedy, who survives.

Mr. Stevens, retired for several years, was a distributor for the Standard Oil Company for thirty-four years. He was a member of Brownstown Lodge No. 60, Knights of Pythias.

Surviving in addition to the widow, is a brother, Leo Stevens, of Brownstown.

A child died in infancy and two brothers and three sisters also are deceased.
