Homer H. Stilwell, Former B'town Business Man, Dies

Seriously ill for the past five months, during which time he was hospitalized on numerous occasions, Homer H. Stilwell, former Brownstown business man, died at 1:30 o'clock Monday afternoon at his home on R1, Freetown, west of Brownstown.

Funeral rites were held this afternoon from the Winklepleck Funeral Home here, followed by burial in Fairview Cemetery.

Marion Ellis, pastor of the Freetown Christian Church, and the Rev. S. S. Lappin, retired Christian evangelist, of Bedford, were in charge of the rites.

Mr. Stilwell, who for twenty-three years owned and operated the Sinclair Service Station, in Brownstown, was born in Brownstown township, July 11, 1891, a son of the late Smith W. and Lydia Acton Stilwell.

All of his sixty-eight years was spent in Brownstown or Brownstown township. After selling his service station interest here he farmed until his retirement several years ago.

He was married in 1912 to Nellie Goss, who survives, as do a daughter, Mrs. Vance Trueblood, of Brownstown; a granddaughter, Eleanor Ann Trueblood, of Brownstown; a brother, Ralph Stilwell, R1, Freetown, and two sisters, Mrs. L. L. Martin and Mrs. Otto Fleetwood, of Brownstown.

Mr. Stilwell was a member of the Ratcliff Grove Christian Church and Brownstown Lodge No. 60, Knights of Pythias.
