Clifford F. Stotz, Retired Businessman, Dies; Rites Tuesday

Funeral rites were held Tuesday afternoon from the Spurgeon Funeral Home for 80-year-old Clifford F. Stotz, who owned and operated a radio and television business in Brownstown for more than 30 years and for many years taught in Jackson County schools.

In failing health the past several months, Mr. Stotz died Saturday mid-afternoon at his family home, 215 East Commerce street.

A native and life-long resident of Brownstown, he was born August 19, 1891, a son of the late John F. and Margaret Marquart Stotz.

On December 22, 1917, in Brownstown, he was married to Miss Mamie Tatlock, a daughter of the late County Superintendent of Schools and Mrs. James Tatlock.

Mrs. Stotz survives as do a daughter, Mrs. Robert L. (Marjorie) Robison, Brownstown R2, two grandchildren; a brother, Oral D. Stotz, of Denver, Colorado, and two sisters, Mrs. Fred C. (Pearl) Davis, of Lisbon, Ohio, and Mrs. Earl (Clara) Stage, of Vallonia.

A son and two brothers are deceased.

Mr. Stotz graduated from Brownstown High School in 1910 and from Franklin College and did graduate work at Indiana University and Old Moore's Hill College.

He taught school until 1930 and then opened his radio and television business here, retiring in 1965. He taught in many county elementary schools and at Medora High School.

He was a veteran of World War I and was a 50-year member of Washington lodge No. 13, Free & Accepted Masons, of Brownstown and Camp Jackson Post #112, American Legion of Brownstown.

Masonic memorial rites were held at the Funeral home Monday evening and the Rev. Staten E. Lightfoot, pastor of Brownstown United Methodist Church of which Mr. Stotz was a member, conducted the funeral rites. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery.
