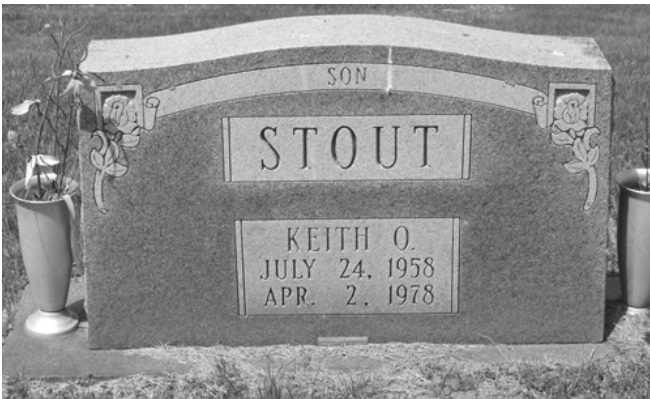

B'town Teen Drowns In Small Pond

A 19-year-old Brownstown youth drowned in a small pond northwest of Spraytown in western Jackson County late Saturday night.

Keith Otis Stout, 19, of Brownstown R1, was found between 5 and 6 a. m. Sunday.

According to state police reports, Stout and several friends were camping in the area.

The group had a party and following the party Saturday night, Stout went to the lake. State police investigators believe Stout fell in the lake and drowned.

The pond is located on land belonging to the U. S. Department of Forestry. It is near

County Road 1125N in Pershing township, Kentucky Avenue is in the area.

Trooper Conrad E. Calmer, of the Seymour post of the Indiana state police, reported Stout and his friends apparently had been drinking before the accident.

An autopsy was performed today. The results will be evaluated by investigators. The death was listed as accidental.

Calmer and Lt. Joe Rorig of the Jackson county sheriff's department conducted the investigation.

Service Wednesday

A lifelong county resident, Mr. Stout was a member of the Brownstown Church of the Nazarene and was employed in the Big Blue warehouse at Seymour.

Born July 24, 1958, in Seymour, he was the son of Lee and Jean Varney Stout.

Surviving in addition to the parents are three brothers, Morris of Roanoke, Ala., Lloyd of Seymour, and Dennis of Nashville, Tenn.; two sisters, Mrs. Roxroy (Frances) Parham of Nashville, Tenn., and Gwen, of Brownstown R1, and the maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Arnold Varney of Huntington, W. Va.

Services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Wednesday from the Brownstown Church of the Nazarene with the pastor, the Rev. Darrell Wineinger, officiating. Burial in Fairview Cemetery, Brownstown.

Friends may call at the Winklepleck-Weesner Funeral Home after noon Tuesday and on Wednesday from 9 a. m. to noon. From 1 to 2 p. m. Wednesday the body will lie in state at the church.
