Stuckwisch—Henry Herman Stuckwisch, a well-known and highly respected farmer, died at his home two miles southeast of Brownstown, Thursday afternoon at 5:30 o'clock. He had been in failing health for several years and for the past six weeks was confined to his bed.

Deceased was the son of Frederick and Wilhelmina Topie Stuckwisch and was born in Brownstown township December 28, 1863, where he spent his entire life. In 1877 he was confirmed in the Lutheran church at Sauers under the pastorate of the Rev. Geo. Sauers and remained steadfast in the faith until death.

On May 24, 1892, he was married to Miss Lizzie Kamman at Sauers by the Rev. F. W. Pohlman. He was a farmer by occupation as long as his health permitted. He was a member of the Wegan Lutheran church.

Short services were held at the home Sunday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock followed by services at the Wegan Lutheran church at 2 o'clock, with the Rev. C. H. Sless officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery, Brownstown.

Surviving besides the widow are two daughters, Misses Lucinda Stuckwisch, at home; Mrs. Geo. Vondielingen, of Brownstown township; three brothers and five sisters: Wm. Stuckwisch of Indianapolis; George, of Driftwood township; Mrs. John Belckman, of Brownstown; Mrs. John Haman, Chris., Misses Amelia, Mary and Katie Stuckwisch, all of Brownstown township.
