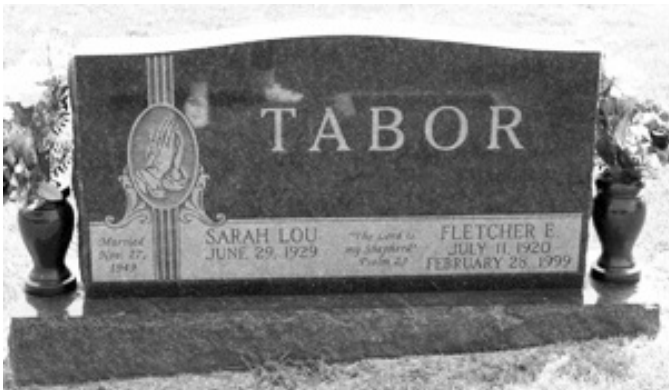

Fletcher E. Tabor, 78, of Brownstown, died at 6:09 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 28, 1999, at Memorial Hospital, Seymour. He retired in 1980, after 30 years at Cummins Engine Company in Columbus. He owned and operated Tabor's TV in Brownstown. He was a member of the Brownstown Christian Church and was a technical sergeant in U.S. Air Force during World War II. He received the Distinguished Flying Cross.

He was a 32nd degree Mason of Washington Lodge No. 13, F & AM in Brownstown. He was a member of the Brownstown American Legion, Post 112 and a member of the Gideons.

Born July 11, 1920, in Brown County, he was the son of John Ross and Lena Fleetwood Tabor. On Nov. 27, 1949, in Brownstown, he married Sarah L. Spurgeon and she survives.

Other survivors include three children, Rebecca Wakefield, Lafayette, Colo.,
