## Mrs. M. Applewhite, Of Brownstown, Dies

Mrs. Myrtle Bolles Applewhite, 92, Brownstown businesswoman and well-known civic leader, died at 3 p. m. Sunday at her home, 1026 West Spring street, Brownstown.

A lifelong resident of Brownstown, she was born December 17, 1875 to W. R. and Rachel Robertson Bolles. On June 5, 1900, she was married at Brownstown to Ralph B. Applewhite, who preceded her in death on February 10, 1920.

Mrs. Applewhite was a member of the Brownstown Presbyterian Church. She was secretary of the Brownstown Public Library for 50 years and served as treasurer of Fairview Cemetery in Brownstown for 50 years. She operated the Bolles Hardware in Brownstown from 1924 to 1954 and during that time was an active member of the Chamber of Commerce.

She was also a member of the Study Club and numerous other community organizations.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2 p. m. Tuesday from the Zabel Funeral Home in Brownstown with the Rev. Robert Reed, pastor of the Brownstown Presbyterian Church, officiating. Burial in Fairview Cemetery.
