Mrs. Rachel Bolles, nee Robertson, was born near Brownstown, Jackson county; Ind., September 13, 1852, and departed this life September 9, 1906. She was the only daughter of John Blaze and Mary Elizabeth Robertson. who preceded her to the grave several years ago. In early youth she gave her heart to the Lord and united with the Christian church, afterwards uniting with the Presbyterian church at Brownstewn, in which connection she fell asleep in Jesus.
