Miss Kittie Schwein Dies At Brownstown

Miss Kittie May Schwein, age fifty, life-long Brownstown resident and employe of the Brownstown Banner for twenty-three years, died late Friday night at her home in Brownstown after an illness of several months' duration. She had been seriously ill only a few weeks.

Miss Schwein was born February 19, 1895, in Brownstown, the daughter of Frank and Lizzie Schwein. The mother survives.

A faithful devoted member of the Brownstown Methodist Church, Miss Schwein was active in the various departments of the church. Prior to her employment at the Banner office, she was a teacher in the Brownstown township schools, and her quiet, friendly disposition and good nature won her a host of friends throughout the county who mourn her death.

She was a member of Camp Jackson Post 112, American Legion Auxilliary, in which organization she held many responsible posts, serving at one time as first vice-president and as chairman of various key committees.

Miss Schwein was an artist of considerable talent and painted pictures as a hobby. Several of her paintings were awarded prizes when displayed at county fairs.

Besides the mother, she is survived by four brothers: William D. Schwein, Ralph E. Schwein and Albert L. Schwein, all of Brownstown and vicinity and Lawrence G. Schwein, of Bucyrus, Ohio; two sisters, Mrs. Claude Vincent, of Brownstown, and Mrs. C. E. Gerhart, of Bucyrus.

Funeral services will be conducted at 2:30 o'clock Monday afternoon from the Brownstown Methodist Church with the Rev. Frank Templin, pastor, in charge. Burial in Fairview Cemetery.
