Alice L. Reedy Thompson, 80,

Cortland, died at 9:09 p.m. Tuesday, April 29, at Columbus Regional Hospital. She had been ill for one week.

She was a member of the Surprise United Methodist Church and was an elementary school teacher, retiring in 1983 after 35 years of teaching. She taught at Surprise Grade School, Cortland Elementary School, and Seymour Community Schools. She was a member of the Retired Teachers Association, Order of Eastern Star at Brownstown, Widows Club of Surprise United Methodist Church, and Delta Kappa Gamma. She was a graduate of Danville Teachers College and Indiana University.
