Mrs. Cora Thompson, Mother Of Mrs. Waldon, Dies—Rites Friday

Funeral rites were held Friday night at 8 o'clock from the Voss Mortuary in Seymour for Mrs. Cora Belle Thompson, 69, mother of Mrs. Clyde Waldon, of Brownstown, who died late Wednesday afternoon at the Waldon home here. She had been ill since mid-winter.

The Rev. Charles W. Taylor, pastor of the First Methodist Church and the Rev. Emory Parks, pastor of the First Methodist Church, Seymour, conducted the last rites. Cremation followed.

Mrs. Thompson who was a native of Freetown, was born January 14, 1885, the daughter of Albert S. DeLong and the late Mrs. DeLong. With the exception of a few years spent in Lawrence county, she had lived in Jackson county all of her life and for a number of years had been a resident of Seymour, and for several years was a member of the Paris Style staff in that city.

She was a member of the Alpha Class of the First Methodist Bible School in Seymour and also a member of the Seymour Auxiliary to the American Legion.

Surviving in addition to the father and Mrs. Waldon are four brothers, Charles DeLong, of Brownstown; Guy DeLong, of Indianapolis; James DeLong, of Muncie and Bruce DeLong, of Milton, Pa. A grandson, Albert Seibert, of Seymour, also survives as do two great-grandchildren, Verney Scott Seibert and Steven Albert Seibert, also of Seymour.
