## Accident Victim

**Donald T. Thompson, 20, Dies In Bedford Hospital Early Sunday Morning From Injuries Suffered In Two-Car Crash.**

Funeral rites were held this afternoon from the Zabel Funeral Home for Donald T. Thompson, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Talmadge Thompson, of Brownstown.

Young Thompson died in the Dunn Memorial Hospital, Bedford, at 1:30 o'clock Sunday morning, one and one-half hours after suffering head, chest and internal injuries, when the car he was driving figured in a two-car accident on U. S. Highway 50, 1.4 miles south of Bedford.

Both Thompson and his wife were thrown from their automobile by the impact. Mrs. Thompson suffered bruises and abrasions and shock and was admitted to the Dunn Hospital.

According to investigating officers young Thompson was traveling south on U. S. 50 when his automobile was sideswiped by a northbound car, driven by George Tincher, 40, Mitchell R3, when his automobile crossed the center line.

The Thompson car was thrown into a ditch hurling the occupants out. Tincher also was admitted to the Dunn Hospital suffering from shock.

The accident is still under investigation by State Trooper Jim Sutton, of the Bloomington sub-post, the Lawrence county deputy sheriff and Lawrence county coroner.

In all probability charges will be filed against Tincher, according to informed sources.

### Victim Born

#### In Brownstown

Young Thompson was born in Brownstown September 25, 1943, a son of Talmadge and Bernice Ozbun Thompson. He was graduated from Brownstown High School and served with the U. S. Army, based in Texas.

Recently he had been a civil employee at Camp Atterbury, near Columbus.

He was married in Brownstown, June 10, 1962, to Jackie Elaine Downing.

Surviving, with the parents and widow, is a brother, Floyd Thompson, who is home for the summer from Indiana University where he is a student.

Dale Anderson, pastor of the Brownstown Christian Church, of which the young accident victim was a member, was in charge of the funeral rites.

Interment was in Fairview Cemetery.
