**Thompson**—Mrs. J. B. Thompson, whose critical illness was mentioned last week, passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Effie McCormick, in Brownstown Thursday evening, January 7, aged 73 years and 7 days. She had been in failing health for some time but had only been confined to her bed two days. About two weeks ago she suffered a slight stroke of paralysis. Later erysipelas developed, which was the immediate cause of her death.

Pernina Waskom was the daughter of Jacob and Mary Ann Waskom and was born in Grassy Fork township December 24, 1852, and spent her entire life in Jackson county. She was married to J. B. Thompson in March, 1873. To their union were born six children, who survive her, viz: Mrs. Nora Browning and Mrs. Effie McCormick, of Brownstown; Mrs. Maude Downing and L. B. Thompson, of Seymour; Ira Thompson, of Sac City, Iowa, and Hugh B. Thompson, of Decatur, Illinois; also one sister, Mrs. Julia Rucker, of Seymour, and three brothers, Omri Waskom, of Brownstown; John Waskom of Vallonia, and William Waskom, of Tampico. Her husband preceded her in death March 18, 1923. The family moved to Brownstown in 1905, where she resided until her death.

Mrs. Thompson was a good mother, an obliging neighbor and her jovial disposition made her many friends. In early life she united with the Baptist church and remained a member until death.

Funeral services, which were largely attended, were held at the Baptist church Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. Carl Winter, assisted by the Rev. F. M. Moore, pastor of the Presbyterian church, officiating. Burial in Fairview cemetery.
