

Robert Trowbridge Found Dead At His Home Here

Robert L. Trowbridge, age 61, was found dead at his home here about 11:00 o'clock Saturday morning by his sister, Mrs. Floyd Pray.

Deputy Coroner Keith Burkholder set the time of death at approximately 3:00 o'clock Saturday morning and ruled that death was due to a heart attack.

Funeral rites were held Monday afternoon from the Zabel Funeral Home, in charge of the Rev. Staten E. Lightfoot, pastor of Brownstown United Methodist Church. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery.

Mr. Trowbridge, who served with distinction during World War II was born in Brownstown on January 8, 1907, a son of the late William and Celia Osee McCory Trowbridge.

He had been in failing health for some time.

Mr. Trowbridge never married. Surviving are four sisters, Mrs. Floyd Pray, of Brownstown, Mrs. Robert Camden, of New Whiteland, Mrs. Clarence Wheeler, of Vallonia, and Mrs. Earl Lindley, of Indianapolis.

He served as a supply clerk in the Asiatic-Pacific Theater during World War II and was awarded the Bronze Star, the American Defense Service Medal and the Good Conduct Ribbon.

Mr. Trowbridge served his country twice. The second time he entered service on January 23, 1942 and was released on July 10, 1945.

He was a laborer and was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars.
