Mrs. Tuell, Of Brownstown, Dies

Mrs. Amanda B. Tuell, 77, a well known citizen of Brownstown, died at 7:30 a. m. today in Schneck Memorial Hospital here, where she was admitted for medical treatment following a fall in her home Thursday night. She had been in failing health for the past year.
