Funeral Held For Clarence Tuell, B'town Resident

Funeral services for Clarence G. Tuell, 85-year-old retired contractor, of Brownstown, who died Saturday at 3:30 a. m. at the Bartholomew County Hospital in Columbus, were conducted at 2 o'clock this afternoon from the Brownstown Christian Church with the Rev. E. Lacy Satterfield, pastor, in charge. Burial was in Fairview Cemetery.

Mr. Tuell, who had been ill for the past year, was the next to the last veteran of the Spanish-American War living in Brownstown.

He was a member of the Brownstown Christian Church and had belonged to Washington Lodge No. 13, Free and Accepted Masons of Brownstown, for the past 46 years and was a 50-year member of the Knights of Pythias of Brownstown.

Born March 11, 1878, in Vallonia, he was the son of the late David and Charlotte Miller Tuell. He had spent most of his life in the Vallonia and Brownstown communities. He was married on September 11, 1902, in Brownstown to Amanda Cochram, who passed away in February of 1960.

Surviving are three daughters, Mrs. Helen Gerritt, of Los Angeles, Calif.; Mrs. Esther Gunn, of Lawndale, Calif., and Mrs. Dorothy Rijnovan, of Japan; five grandchildren, seven great grandchildren, and a sister, Mrs. Stella Dixon, of Brownstown. Four brothers and four sisters preceded him in death.
